

SUPPORT GREENHAM WOMEN

For more than two years many courageous women have been camping on common land outside the Greenham Cruise missile base to protest against the stationing there of nuclear bomb-carrying pilotless flying machines.

The women protestors see this base as part and parcel of the extermination machine, capable of unleashing death and destruction on a massive scale.

Many brave sorties in and around the base have been made by the women protestors and these will continue against mounting pressure and persecution by the British Government and Newbury Council.

Greenham Woman Faces Prison Sentence

As part of their campaign the Greenham women decided to bring court proceedings against Reagan. They claim that the deployment of cruise missiles is illegal under international law because of their potential to kill millions of citizens. With this aim in mind some of their supporters were sent to America on a fund and consciousness-raising tour. Jean Hutchinson was one of these people.

In Walled Lake, Michigan, the town where cruise missiles are manufactured in their thousands, Jean Hutchinson addressed a Christian group, 'Covenant for Peace'. This action was deemed illegal under an injunction which prohibits the blocking of the cruise-making factory, or 'encouraging, inducing, inciting and pressurising' others to do so.

Next day, whilst attending a demonstration as an observer, Jean was arrested and charged with conspiracy to obstruct, to commit trespass and to disturb the peace. If convicted, Jean Hutchinson can go to prison for 2½ years.
